Practical Information & guidelines Prices mentioned are applicable from 1 October 2019 until 15 March 2020. The campus is closed for visitors in the hot summer and humid monsoon. Day visit fee includes one meal and coffee/tea. Fees of overnight stays include three vegetarian meals a day, coffee/tea and (private) access to a meeting room with projector, dining space and WIFI. Depending on availability, rooms are private or shared, bathrooms both attached and detached. Loka's Centre is in a remote area and electricity and internet supply may fluctuate and there are no shops in the vicinity. Loka hosts both individual visitors and small groups up to 8-10 people. Airport Transport to/from Varanasi (225 km), Gaya/ Bodhgaya (110 km) and Patna (130 km) is provided upon request and day trips to these places can be included in the stay. To make your visit an enriching experience, we kindly request quests to be sensitive to local customs and traditions. We look forward to welcome you to the sacred space called Loka.

Location and Contact

Loka's Centre is located in a village in North-India. The organic farm, flower gardens and trees provide an excellent atmosphere for learning and reflection. The school building and office are finely decorated with Mithila style murals. Rooms are furnished with hand crafted wooden furniture, made with love by a local carpenter. Loka's Centre is situated at the entrance of village Manikpur with a population of 750 people, mostly small-scale farmers. Students of Loka live with their families in mud huts or unfurnished brick houses in an authentic surrounding where the connections between production and use are visible and bonds between people close.
